Profile of the partner	The prison JVA Zweibrücken is an institution of the Rhineland-Palatinate Justice.
Objectives and regular activities	It was built in 1839 - 1845 as a Bavarian county jail. Since then it had been expanded extensively and continues to expand and modernize. We are the “central training institution” of Rhineland-Palatinate. Male and female prisoners are trained together in many various professions. At present, JVA Zweibrücken is employing 321 women and men of different professions e.g. lawyers, psychologists, counsellors, social workers and a doctor.
Experiences of similar actions in relation to role in the implementation of the proposed action	Prison Zweibrücken has a lot of experience in treatment of violence offenders and gender crime. Furthermore we managed two refugee camps for several month.

Contribution of the partner to CAPTIVE	Germany will help the University of Malta in leading WS3 (to contribute to develop effective response strategies to provide victims of S/GBV with the necessary help service; to promote the participation of migrant women victims of violence as agents of change inside the migrant community. To develop resilience an coping strategies for migrant women, victims of S/GBV;to identify roles and responsibilities of social actors in an ideal support system of migrant victims of GBV and to establish a referral system in the migrant communities). The organization will also support ANFE in leading WS\$ (to promote a European Protocol to establish an efficient support system for migrant women, victims or potential victims of

To increase knowledge on experience of S/GBV in migrant and refugee population across the 6 participating countries.2. To increase knowledge about professional's and service provider's experiences in providing support to individuals affected by S/GBV from refugee/migrant and refugee populations.3. To analyse perceptions about the influence of the culture of origin in experiences of S/GBV4. To map support services for victims of S/GBV from refugee/migrant backgrounds operating in local welfare systems5. To integrate data across different communities and countries to identify meaningful outcomes that can be targets for community-based interventions to prevent S/GBV6. To share good practice information7. Based on the above, to assist in the developing of training courses focused on strengthening ethno-cultural competences around intervention for S/GBV in order to improve support to victims and reduce S/GBV in refugee and migrant communities8. To organise two meetings to define the "ideal multicultural support system" needed for migrant women, victims of S/GBV9. Prevention activity to fight and promote prevention policies against S/GBV – to organise three workshops oriented at migrant communities, working with vulnerable groups such as refugees, asylum and those seeking international protection seekers and a final workshop for institutions, professionals and service providers to share and promote the results obtained in the first three workshops.10. The Management of the "Support Desk" for women victims. This service will be opened twice or once a week and be provided by a cultural mediator and/or by a service provider.11. Empowering skills and competences of victims and professionals through two different training courses on S/GBV and related issues.
